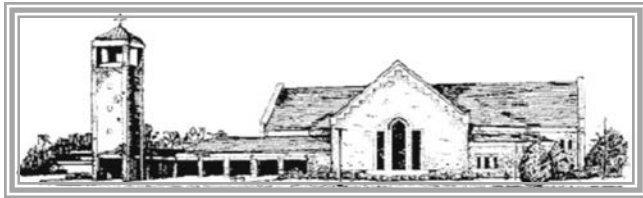

On a different note, Lisa Fendrich of our parish, as well as myself, will be travelling to our sister parish in Guatemala from Wednesday, October 24 through Monday, October 29. The occasion is the beatification of two martyrs from our sister parish, Blessed Tullio Maruzzo, OFM and Blessed Luis Obdulio Arroyo which will take place on Saturday, October 27. Blessed Tullio was a Franciscan priest and pastor of our sister parish, Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and Blessed Luis Obdulio was a lay catechist in the parish. Both were assassinated on July 1, 1981 while standing up for parishioner land rights during the Guatemalan civil war that took place from 1960 to 1996. Both martyrs are deeply loved by the parishioners of our sister parish. It is a privilege to have been invited to participate in this beatification and Lisa and I will certainly carry in prayer all our St. Agnes parishioners as we celebrate with our brothers and sisters in the faith.

At all Masses for next Sunday (October 20/21) we will have a special second collection taken up after Holy Communion in support of our sister parish.
