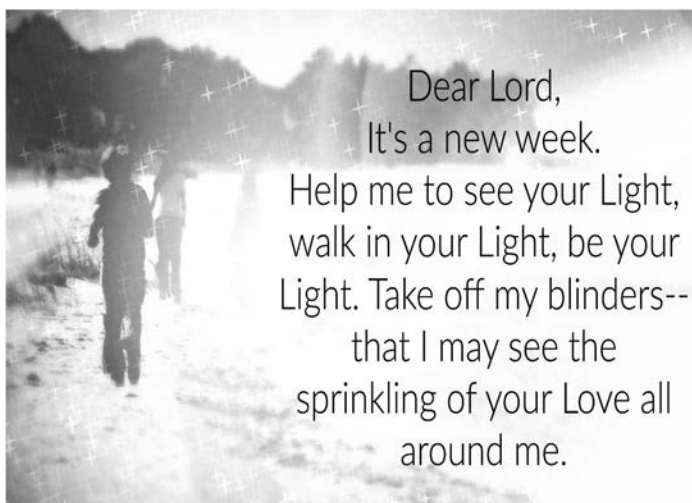

November and Remembering = NOVEMBERING During the month of November, you are invited to bring a framed photo of your deceased loved one to St. Agnes, and we will display it in a place of honor in the church in the tradition of Dia De Los Muertos. This is a Hispanic tradition where they dead are honored and celebrated during the month of November, especially on All Saints Day and All Souls Day. In many countries, it is a celebration of life **and** death, that honors their memory with food, music, dance and parades. Symbolism plays an important role in the festivities, where an altar is created to honor the loved ones with flowers, foods, decorations, and other things the loved ones enjoyed while they were here on earth. You may also bring a small item to place next to the photo that reminds you of their time on earth, maybe a religious symbol, food, animal or other memento, or a simple flower or decoration. Please make sure it is not something valuable or irreplaceable, as we **can not guarantee 100%** that it will be returned, though we will try. From the Vatican – Proclaiming the joy of the Gospel is the mission entrusted by the Lord to his Church. In keeping with this mission Pope Francis is introducing a new approach through a 2018 Bishops’ Synod with the topic, “Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment.” The Church has decided to examine herself on how she can lead young people to recognize and accept the call to the fullness of life and love, and to ask young people to help her in identifying the most effective ways to announce the Good News today. In terms of hearing directly from young people, the Vatican has launched a survey for youth and young adults.
