We are within minutes of work for those employed at Springfield's hospitals and other medical facilities; the state capitol complex; and downtown businesses. We offer multiple, full- and half-day, pre-school schedule options for three- and four-year olds. A faculty-supervised, after-school program provides a "study hall" setting where students can do homework and study prior to pick-up by parents (through 5:45 p.m.) every school day. Parents have instant, online access to grades and assignments and access to teachers by phone, personal appointment and email. More than \$60,000 has been awarded to families through the St. Agnes School tuition assistance program.

Restored Order Sacraments—Why and How?

It has been awhile since the Diocesan Synod and the Bishop's decree moving the age of Confirmation to 7 years old (about third grade). Since we are coming up on Lent and sacramental celebrations, it might be a good time to take another look at the whys and hows of Restored Order Sacraments.

For St. Agnes, a transition to restored order means exactly that; we will have a few years of transition where children of various ages will be preparing for and celebrating Confirmation and/or First Eucharist until we "land" at grade 3. But we want to do this well and set the children and their families up for a lifetime of faithful discipleship. This year, on March 25 children in 8th grade will celebrate Confirmation and children in 3rd grade will celebrate Confirmation and First Eucharist. Then we will begin preparing the next group for a fall or winter 2020 celebration. Preparation includes several retreats and gatherings, work with a godparent/sponsor, researching a saint and doing a discipleship project. As we learn more about what works and what our children need, we will adapt and grow the process.

But, why the switch? Hasn't Confirmation always been a rite of passage for young people to become adults in the Church? To choose the faith for themselves? Actually, NO! Confirmation has never been about maturity or adulthood or completing a course of study. It has always been about God Confirming his Chosen. In the early church, Confirmation was not separate from Baptism and happened as early as childhood, or whenever a person was Baptized. Confirmation is all about God pouring out God's gifts

upon us so we can go and be disciples. One can be a disciple at any age.

In today's culture, kids need all the strength and advantages they can get. Kids are exposed to violence and bullying through social media and technology gives kids access to controversial content at younger ages. All of this exposure is 24/7; unrelenting and invasive.

Besides, why not capture the energy and spirit of a young person who is eager to receive God's Grace and then put it into action? All are called by Baptism and can be strengthened in Confirmation to spread the Gospel, work for justice and serve with compassion.

As a sacrament of initiation, put in its proper order, being Confirmed, then, compels us to continue the journey. Those who have been Confirmed need to continue learning about their faith, and grow in their relationship with God. Continuing faith formation will be expected for children and teens but you will see new, creative opportunities for learning, serving and praying here at St. Agnes. Please come along on the journey!
