A message from Fr. Dan

Jesus' disciples asks Him how to pray. Then Jesus replies with the "Our Father." This beloved prayer is etched into our hearts. The heart of prayer is in relationship and communication with our Lord. This includes both the speaker and the listener. Ideally both the Lord and ourselves serve in both roles. Yet sometimes we find that we are just "saying" prayers instead of praying prayers from our heart. Thus both speaking and listening as well as letting the Lord know what is on our hearts is essential. Another notable is that Jesus tells us to "Ask, Seek and Knock." Just like you may ask a friend for help or seek advice and visit to spend time together. This approach seems very human, very personable and at the same time also very Divine!

WHO IS FR. DAN? Sometimes we can approach a priest like he is a functionary fresh off priestly assembly line. Lucky for us and our Catholic Church that is not the case. Priests are not from another parish or from the seminary. They are nurtured in families of faith. Better yet many priests grow up in good and holy families that are pretty messy at times. Yes, holiness and perfection are two different things...but that is another homily. Because of this essential family link priests can remain humble sons, brothers, uncles and cousins to many. They keep the priest grounded in reality lest his ego becomes to "ginormous"!

Fr. Dan's parents are Don and Donna Bergbower who have been married 64 years. Dad is from Newton, IL and Mom from Steamboat Springs, CO. They met in San Diego as dad was in the Navy for 23 years. Both now live in Effingham and mom has been in memory care for the past 18 months. Dad lives at home. There are 5 of us children. My sister is married with two adult children and along with her husband live in Effingham. My next oldest is a brother who is married and has 3 adult children. He and his wife live in upstate New York. I am the third sibling. My younger brother lives in Springfield, MO and is single and the youngest is married and lives with his wife in rural Effingham area. Health Exam Information: Children entering Preschool, Kindergarten or 6th Grade must have a **complete written Health Exam**, with up-to-date Immunizations, turned in to the School Office before the first day of school, on August 16. Children entering Kindergarten, 2nd or 6th Grade, are required to have a **Dental Exam** completed. Entering Kindergarteners must also have an **Eye Exam** by an Optometrist. Please note, **new students transferring** to Illinois from another State or from outside the U.S. must have complete Health, Dental and Eye Exams and up-to-date Immunizations, regardless of entering grade. All forms should be turned in to the School Office on Fee Day, Thursday, August 15.



SPORTS PHYSICALS

Sports Physicals: Incoming 5th – 8th Graders, participating in the St. Agnes Sports program, are required to have a 2019 physical in order to participate. Physicals for all incoming 6th Graders are required by the school, however these school physical forms do not cover sports. The **IESA Physical Form** must be completed. A copy of the physical should be dated for the 2019-2020 school year and must be submitted before sports practices begin.

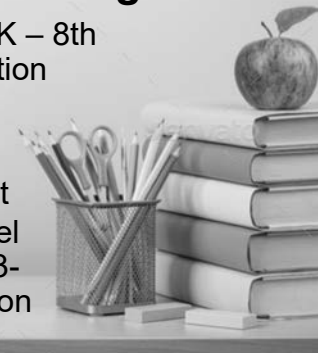
