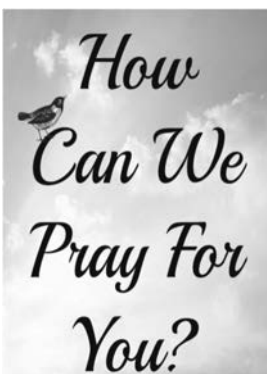

A message from Fr. Dan

As in today's Gospel we hear again about the deadly sin of greed. So does that mean money and wealth is bad? No! Not at all! In fact it is quite the opposite when we look more deeply into the meaning of these scriptures. Fundamentally money is "A-Moral" meaning, it is neither good nor bad. It is how we use it which determines the morality surrounding it. If indeed we use it solely for our own purposes and no one else's, as in the case made by Jesus in today's scripture then yes, it is immoral and un-Christlike. However, if we use our wealth as God intended, then indeed it will make the world a much better place and enhance our life and calling as a follower of Jesus Christ.

So how does God intend us to use our wealth? Very simply through the very Biblical concept of tithing. The Biblical Tithing is defined numerous times in the Old Testament as the FIRST 10% of our income (just Google it for the list of scriptural references). We get 90% and God's work gets 10%. Once you begin and take this leap of faith by starting with 1% then annually adjusting 0.5% you will see how easy and lifegiving generosity can become.

It always seems amazing to me when this pastor (me, Fr. Dan) speaks about my own tithing story. Like many, it began with fear, and now after 25 years my tithe is well beyond the 10% and to be honest, I haven't "missed" it at all! You cannot out give God no matter how hard you try! Take the challenge and begin if you haven't already begun. If you have, you certainly understand what true Christian Generosity IS!

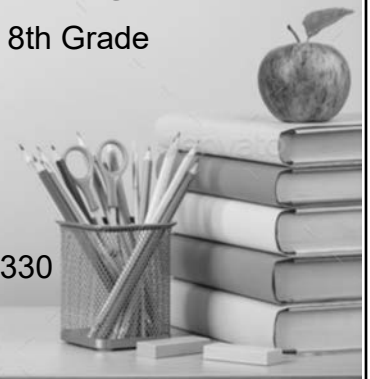


Health Exam Information: Children entering Preschool, Kindergarten or 6th Grade must have a **complete written Health Exam**, with up-to-date Immunizations, turned in to the school office before the first day of school, on August 16. Children entering Kindergarten, 2nd or 6th Grade, are required to have a **Dental Exam** completed. Entering Kindergarteners must also have an **Eye Exam** by an Optometrist. Please note, **new students transferring** to Illinois from another State or from outside the U.S. must have complete Health, Dental and Eye Exams and up-to-date Immunizations, regardless of entering grade. All forms should be turned in to the school office on Fee Day, Thursday, August 15.

Sports Physicals: Incoming 5th - 8th Graders, participating in the St. Agnes Sports program, are required to have a 2019 physical in order to participate. Physicals for all incoming 6th Graders are required by the school, however these school physical forms do not cover sports. The **IESA Physical Form** must be completed. A copy of the physical should be dated for the 2019-2020 school year and must be submitted before sports practices begin.

Mission Appeals – Diocese of Same, Tanzania, Africa: Father Mansuetus Setonga from the Diocese of Same, Tanzania, Africa will be celebrating our Masses during the weekend of August 3-4, and will share his Ministry as the Director of Pastoral Services and Development. The Diocese of Same is located in northeastern Tanzania in the Kilimanjaro Region with a population of 623,000 people, of which 45% are Christian (74,100 Catholic), 35% are Muslims, and 20% follow traditional African religions. Tanzania is one of the poorest countries in the world, with 80% of the population residing in rural areas where subsistence economy is practiced. The standard of living for the people of the Diocese of Same is the lowest in Tanzania where most earn less than \$1.00 a day to support their families. Father Setonga's Bishop wishes to build a medical clinic to serve the Ruvu basin, which represent approximately 4,000 people in 7 villages. Without this clinic the people would continue to walk 8 hours to the nearest clinic. Please welcome Father Setonga to our Parish!
