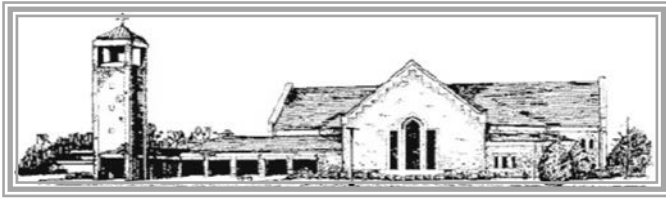

Friday, August 16 is the first day of school for grades K-8. There will be a 1:30 p.m. dismissal. No late day available on this day. Hot Lunch will be served.

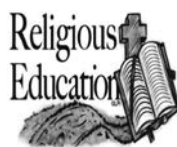
Monday, August 19 is the first full day of school. Late Day program begins.
