A Letter from the Bishop

(Campaign for Justice and Hope)

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Saint Teresa of Calcutta devoted her life to serving the poor, the sick, the needy and helpless; giving them dignity and improving their life. These are the very same purposes we achieve through our Diocesan Campaign for Justice and Hope (DCJH). Thank you to everyone who participated in the voting process of choosing Saint Teresa as the patron saint of DCJH. I wholeheartedly agree with this suggestion and hereby declare Saint Teresa of Calcutta patron saint of our Diocesan Campaign for Justice and Hope.

How fitting that she was chosen as the patron saint of DCJH. Like Saint Teresa, who brought direct aid to the poor, DCJH achieves the same goal through providing financial aid to agencies whose mission is to help the poorest of the poor at our own doorstep (Luke 16:20). Last year, twenty-three organizations throughout the diocese were offered grants. Through your contributions we are able to grant funds to known entities such as Habit for Humanity and lesser known organizations such as the Highland Area Christian Service Ministry. Thank you!!

Examples such as these are possible because of your financial contributions during the annual DCJH campaign.
